This time around the two clubs find themselves in differing situations. East Grinstead secured Premier League hockey next season with a comfortable 5-0 victory over bottom of the league Brooklands.

The Green and Gold travelled down to Exeter University in a battle of the league's two University teams with only a point separating the two. Nottingham took a commanding 4-1 lead in the third quarter with Exeter gain a consolation goal on the full time whistle to end the gam 4-2. That result meant that Nottingham leap frogged Exeter in the tables, taking them outside the relegation places with two games to play. With only 2 points separating the two sides and 6 points up for grabs, it is going down to the wire for which team will secure their Premier League status.





On the Wednesday past, the 2XI travelled to Cardiff play in front of a huge home crowd for the chance to Met University to play the semi-final of our vase competition. The journey was long, and the weather was terrible, however the lads were in good spirits under the knowledge that a bus carrying 80 supporters was accompanying us to cheer us through the game. The game began in typical knock-out fashion and was cagey to start with however when a fine strike Men's Captain - Archie Foster from Luke Holland rebounded off the post into the path of Ollie King, he was able to tap the ball in and put us 1-0 up inside the first quarter. In a game that ebbed and flowed, conditions meant clear-cut chances were few and far in between but with 10 minutes to go, Cardiff hit us on the counter, won a penalty stroke and converted it to equalise. This seemed to act as a wake-up call for us as we raised our game which led to us winning a string of short corners. The knockout blow was scored with under two minutes on the clock as we converted a short corner to make the game 2-1 creating jubilant scenes both on and off the pitch.

To have that many supporters make a three-and-ahalf-hour journey to Cardiff to support us through the game is a testament to us as a club. Led by senior members of the club, when news broke that there was an opportunity for an away day, the club sprung into action and the seats on the bus were filled within an hour. It is an amazing feeling playing in a game falling walls being belted out and it really does make a difference. As a club we are in a very fortunate position that everyone buys into the culture and long may it continue.

As a squad, we cannot wait for Wednesday to come around now. After winning back-to-back league titles, we were really keen to try and enjoy a cup run this year and we've been fortunate enough to do that so far. We've seen real development through the team this year and we are relishing the opportunity to


